BLASTING NOTIFICATION

Dear Businesses/Homeowner/Residents:

This notification is to inform you that CBNA Barletta will begin Controlled Blasting Activities at the **Construction Site located at 804 School Street, Pawtucket, RI** commencing on or after August 10, 2021. As a courtesy, we can email you prior to each blast. If you would like to be placed on the pre-blast notification list, please notify CB3A by emailing notifications@cb3a.com. Blasting will begin within a 72' diameter shaft at a depth of approximately 60' below the existing ground surface. Blasting will continue within the shaft and an adjacent shaft for the next six months. We anticipate not more than three (3) blasts per week. CB3A anticipates minor disruption to the adjacent neighbors.

A series of **HORN** signals will be used to warn personnel at the site and nearby residents prior to each blast. Each blast will be preceded by a security check of the affected area and then a series of warning pulses. The signal sequence will be:

WARNING SIGNAL: Three long HORN signals five minutes prior to blast signal

BLAST SIGNAL: Two HORN signals one minute prior to the shot

ALL CLEAR SIGNAL: A prolonged HORN signal following an inspection of the blast area

The site will be posted with well-marked with highly visible signs that detail the pulse warning signal sequence sounded prior to the commencement of each blast. The signal may be audible to neighboring residents or the public. All blasting operations will be conducted during daylight hours Monday thru Saturday between 7AM and 5PM, and no explosives will be stored at the construction site overnight. For each blast, traffic will be stopped and pedestrians will not be allowed access on School Street at each end of the blast site for not more than 15 minutes. There will also be seismographs set up at the nearest abutting residences to the blasting to record ground and air vibrations to ensure limits are not exceeded.
